Happy Birthday to Us!

Now in its fifth year and approaching its fiftieth issue, The Archer is totally different from all other local newspapers.

The most apparent difference from a reader's perspective is its appearance: very few advertisements. Other local newspapers are crammed with advertisements, estate agents galore, up to 75 per cent sometimes. The Archer's policy is that no more than one quarter will be occupied by advertisements.

Vive La Difference

Another main difference is the editorial content. Other papers circulated in East Finchley include other North London news, among all the advertising while The Archer, concentrates

on East Finchley and its borders. It focuses on local people and carries features that will hopefully interest local people.

Unlike all the other papers The Archer is a true community paper, the only one of its type in London, we believe. That is to say: it is produced for the East Finchley community by the community.

Team work

All who work on the paper are volunteers. The active team is about 20 strong and is a mixture of East Finchley people who give up some of their spare time to produce The Archer.

All 15,000 words (the average issue word count) are written and most of the photographs are taken by the team. It is designed and laid out by the team. It is distributed to 7,000 letter boxes by the team.

Penniless

No member of the team receives a penny for this work. Members do it because they like doing it and they believe in The Archer's declared aim to preserve and enhance the community.

National Meals on Wheels Day

National Meals on Wheels day was celebrated throughout Barnet with a special menu for all who receive meals from this service.

The council provides about 390,000 meals per year to our elderly and house-bound residents. Last November the council started a new weekend service by providing hot meals to people living alone who can not prepare meal for themselves and do not have carers or relatives to cook for them.

A Wide Choice

With an emphasis on a healthy diet there is a choice of meals, including Asian meals, and also to suit people on low fat or vegetarian diets.

High Quality Service

"I am please that Barnet Council is now offering such a high quality to those most in need in the community" said councillor Helen Gordon, Chair of Social Services Committee. "Working in partnership with voluntary organisations, we are providing a first class service to local families" she added.

These meals are prepared at our local schools by council staff and delivered in partnership with "Finchley Age Concern".
