### Peoples Bank



His family moved to East Finchley when he was three and they lived in Aveton Road which is now the area known as Prospect Place in the Market Place, East Finchley. He married Violet, who had lived in the same

road, and they had six children - four girls and two boys.

In his early years he was a member of the 81st North London Scout Group with its head-quarters in the Market Place and the Group is now known as the 1st East Finchley which is situated at The Better Ole in New Trinity Road.

He attended Holy Trinity Primary School and later attained a place at Woodhouse Grammar School. After leaving school he tried his hand at various jobs: a boy billiard marker for a snooker hall on the site of the old Railway Arms in Church End, Finchley; a pharmacist and a taxi mechanic.

At that time the family firm, under his father Fred, was dealing in second-hand furniture using a horse and cart from a yard in Chapel Street in the Market Place.

### **Racing start**

He used to be up at 3am and arrive at Covent Garden to collect the fruit and vegetables for

Walters the greengrocer, which is still in the High Road, and after this he would pick up racing pigeons from the Five Bells public house in East End Road, and from Friern Barnet to transport them to Kings Cross station.

Later in his life he became a keen allotment holder in the Fuel Lands Allotment Society.
