Heather Salter

Heather Salter, a governor at Northside primary school, was tragically killed in the coach crash in South Africa on Monday 27 September.

Originally from Wrexham, Heather was a widow who lived in Barnet for over 30 years. A retired teacher who worked at Tetherdown School in Haringey, she became a school governor at Northside in North Finchley in 1996.

Councillor Anne Jarvis, Chair of Education said: "Heather was a very committed governor at Northside and was working to re-catalogue the library there in her role as the school's literacy governor. She will be sadly missed at the school, where staff and governors were stunned at the news of her death. Our sympathy goes out to her family and friends at this difficult time." A letter informing parents of the sad news was sent out by the school. Fond of travelling and a keen golfer, Heather was also active politically in Barnet and was Chair of the Ladies' Committee of the local Conservative Association. She was also a member of the Association's St Paul's branch. Conservative Councillor for Hadley ward, Liz Mammatt, said: "Heather was a good and kind person who we will miss tremendously". The original steering group, who have been busy organising and training for the last 12 months, are supported by Barnet Council's Economic Development worker, Janet Thorne. For obvious reasons they have to follow stringent financial and legal procedures, but they hope that all the preparations should be in place for a start date by the end of the year.

A similar Credit Union in Barnet has been running very successfully for the past year at Grahame Park and has 135 members. "We expect to be equally successful in Finchley", says Kim.

However, further volunteers are needed to join the 12 steering group members. They are particularly looking for someone to take the role of Treasurer. Can you help?
