The battle to save Long Lane pasture has been lost after councillors voted to put the land up for tender.

Despite a demonstration and a petition of 1213 signatures, councillors insisted that the land would be of more use for social

Cllr Kathy McGuirk (Lab, St Paul's) said, "It is simply not right to abandon people needing homes. Putting plants before people is not the answer.'

Barnet Council has already started discussions with Fairview New Homes over a proposed development of 89 one- and two-bedroom flats and six special needs flats on the site.
