

Do you ever wonder what goes on in the white churchlike building behind the iron fence at 142 High Road, East Finchley? The activities there are funded by Barnet Youth Service and they are available for youngsters between the ages of (roughly) nine to twenty five.

Julian Bergin has recently taken over as theatre manager. With a background as an actor in the Theatre in Education and community theatre which took him all over the country, as well as eight years as Head of Drama at Highgate Wood School, he is well qualified for the position. Julian told me that the Youth Theatre works to encourage expression through involvement in a range of drama based activities. If the performance which I saw is anything to go by, it is certainly meeting its aim.

I watched a "forum theatre" event extremely well written and performed by a group of fifteen to eighteen years old. It dealt with the complex subject of anorexia and, when it was over, the audience and the performers interacted to discuss and revise the action and dialogue. Ideas and reactions flew thick and fast and I was amazed at how involved I became with it all!
