# Attempted robbery

On Tuesday 19 September 2000 at approximately 6 pm a man entered Josephine's, 58-60 High Road, and approached a 58-year-old female florist working at the rear of the shop.

He produced a knife with a 3-5" blade, waved it in the victim's face and shouted at her to give him the money. The victim shouted to her husband who chased the man from the property. Nothing was stolen. The husband pursued the male along the High Road into Fairlawn Avenue and lost him in Fortis Green.

The suspect is described as being of dark European appearance, about 20 years old, approximately 5'6", thin build, short black hair with facial stubble, wearing a dark coloured baseball cap and dark clothing.


## Turning Point

Barnet Council has issued a change of use notice for the offices situated above Barclays Bank, 82 High Road, East Finchley. They are proposing the setting up of a counselling and advice centre for people suffering with drug and alcohol problems. It would be called "Motiv8" and would be run by the registered charity Turning Point which has a base at Colindale Hospital.

A manager and four staff would provide non-medical, community based group or one-to-one advice and discussion sessions. The centre would be open daily from 10am-5pm, 8pm on Thursdays. It is envisaged that the number of daily clients would be 10-15 maximum.

The proximity of the tube station and conjunction of bus routes make East Finchley a favourable site for such a project. However, some residents in Fairlawn Avenue have expressed concern about the effects on the locality. Their fears include extra traffic causing congestion as well as parking problems, plus possible damage to property or persons. It is reported that an alley directly behind them is already used for dubious purposes, particularly at night. Some also feel that they were not given enough time to properly prepare an appeal against the project.

The proposal will be discussed at a Council planning meeting on 25 October.

# Streetwise?

Barnet's new special cleansing of blocks of roads, from which all residential roads in the borough will benefit twice a year, is now in progress. In theory it is a praiseworthy scheme, but in practice it leaves some areas uncovered.

Residents are asked not to park in their roads between 8am and 4pm. But where are they supposed to go to when all the neighbouring roads are also being cleaned?

Then there are the commuters who, despite warning notices, even park over the piles of brushed up rubbish waiting for collection!

According to the borough's letter to residents, "Where commuter parking prevents thorough cleaning, we will review operations and seek special solutions."

Surely it's obvious that commuters should be given prior warning and told to leave their cars elsewhere or at home on that day?

#### **Common Sense**
