

By Diana Cormack Community Focus is a specialist arts centre dedicated to working with disabled people of all ages. Activities provided include photography, video, needlecraft, dance, drama and

"Art Going Places" is taking travelling community artists to older and disabled people in residential homes and day centres and other unrepresentative groups, such as those on low income or on benefit. The project offers a range of short-term creative "starter" workshops tailored to suit all ages and abilities. Alongside the art activities there are reminiscence workshops where talking, telling stories and listening to music from earlier days provide a stimulating social environment for conversation.

From 18 September disabled adults with a keen interest in art who wish to experiment in their chosen media will be able to do so. Independent art work is encouraged in The Art Studio which will provide a vast range of materials and equipment, along with supportive, experienced community artists.

Arts and Cinema

For cinema aficionados August was a tremendous month for the Phoenix. As well as the Sunday Movie Matinees which included Strangers on a Train, American Beauty plus The Talented Mr. Ripley, there was a plethora of good things to see.



This started with *High Fidelity*, the film based on the Nick Hornby novel. Set in Chicago, it focused on the problematic love life of the central character, Rob (John Cusack). Saddled with a record store, weighed down by two accomplices, both best kept at arms length, Rob confides his thoughts to the audience. This is a device which does not always come off, it is dependent on the sympathy the confessor can muster up. However, it worked beautifully and although reminiscent of Alfie in places, this film had its own charm and was a pleasure to watch.

The following week the Phoenix presented Jean Luc Goddard's A Bout de Soufflé (Breathless) starring Jean Paul Belmondo. He is on the run after shooting a gendarme and adopts an anti-hero stance throughout. Though hunted down, he does have the luxury of Jean Seberg as a companion. Who says crime doesn't pay? The jazz score, the settings and the improvised camera shots go to make A Bout de Soufflé both stylish and inspirational.

Kadosh (Sacred) opened on 11 August and depicted the dominant patriarchal society of the orthodox Jewish community in Jerusalem. As a consequence of observing their ultra strict code, the two sisters who are the focus of the film are subjugated to the demands of their partners with sometimes sad consequences. The film is a moving tribute to the human spirit when there is sacrifice of self-interest in order to honour and obey. Wonderfully acted, this film deserves wider acclaim.

Concluding the month's movies was Le Beau Travail about the alienated lives of new recruits in the French Foreign Legion. A film of striking imagery and memorable moments, this too merits a wider audience.
