

A serious accident occurred in East End Road on Wednesday 7 November when the 143 bus was involved in a collision with a pedestrian.

The accident took place at around 3.15 pm on the pelican crossing near Church Lane, after which the traffic stood still for nearly three hours.

A spokesman for the Metropolitan police said that the a local elderly lady was trying to cross the road on the pelican crossing and was hit by the bus's front doors as she leant forward. She sustained head injuries and is currently still in hospital where she is in a critical but stable condition.

The scene caused traffic chaos for hours, but none of the by standers or local shopkeepers seemed to know exactly what had happened. According to the police there were no clues to be found on the bus, standing further down the road, as to how the accident had occurred.

Serious injuries

Sergeant O'Donnell who was at the scene, said, "We are not sure of the circumstances at this stage or whether the pedestrian was on the road or not when it happened. We know it is an elderly person who has gone to hospital with serious head injuries."
