The quality of life for all local people is set to improve after initiatives to promote better health and tackle health inequalities in Barnet have been given the go ahead.

Members of the Environment Policy Development Committee have backed the council's five-year public health strategy.

Measures to address the priorities include:

*Designating specific areas of deprivation and poor health as "areas for special action".

*Developing food co-operatives so people have access to low-cost, high quality foods.
*Extending the "Smoke Free

*Extending the "Smoke Free in Barnet" initiative to promote more eateries that provide smoke-free environments for their customers.

*Increasing the take up of the Heartbeat Awards to promote healthier menu options.

*Providing and promoting affordable leisure facilities.

This work builds on a wealth of successful schemes within the borough such as the Fitness for Life programme for the over-40s at risk from coronary heart disease, the healthy schools initiative and the Autumn Days scheme which promotes recreation and leisure activities for older people.

Support for clean-up campaign

Posters encouraging local residents and businesses to continue supporting Barnet Council's £2m clean-up campaign by reporting grime hotspots to the new hotline will be displayed in the borough.

The clean-up hotline is 020 8359 6035. It has been introduced for street litter, overflowing bins, fly-tipping, abandoned cars, graffiti, broken pavements and potholes.

The hotline operates from 9am to 5pm from Monday to Friday. At weekends and outside these hours, callers are able to leave a message, which will be responded to on the next working day. Once a call has been logged, the council's clean-up teams will act effectively and quickly.

Barnet Council also wants the public to use the clean-up hotline to report fly-tippers and graffiti vandals and it will press for prosecutions every time.

Traffic and parking review

A major review of traffic, transportation and parking in the borough is soon to be re-launched.

An initial review was started two years ago but has been dogged by problems of changing staff and difficulties in meeting set deadlines for the process.

Cabinet member for Best Value and Performance, Cllr Nathaniel Rudolf, said: "This review has highlighted organisational issues in the service area and the fact that we were learning as we went along in this new process".

The review will cover issues such as transport strategy, public transport planning, air quality management, street lighting, street cleaning, cycling, road safety and parking.

Gordon steps down

Pressure of work has forced Councillor Helen Gordon to give up her position as Deputy Leader of Barnet Council.

She is also standing down as Policy committee Chair and will no longer sit in the cabinet in charge of social exclusion.

Councillor Gordon was Labour's candidate for the Barnet-Camden seat on the Greater London Assembly last May which she lost narrowly to Tory Councillor Brian Coleman.

However Helen will continue to represent East Finchley ward.
