Daylight Robberies

Police are appealing for witnesses to two armed robberies on post offices on 9 July.

The first was at about 12.30pm at 172 Cricklewood Lane, NW2. Approximately £30 was stolen and the two suspects then made off on foot.

The second was at 591 High Road, North Finchley, N12 at about 3pm - but staff activated the alarm and the two suspects left without anything, decamping in what is believed to be a large green saloon car that headed south down the High Road.

The suspects are believed to be the same for both crimes: two black men wearing green or grey balaclavas and carrying a small, black handgun. No shots were fired.

Stabbing Spree

Two men were stabbed and two more injured trying to stop a suspected shoplifter in North Finchley on the morning of 15 July.

The manager of Jake's Menswear, High Road, N12, was stabbed in the stomach when he challenged a man who had left the premises, allegedly wearing an unpaid for suit.

The suspect was then chased by members of the public for about 200 yards down the High Road, before being confronted by a uniformed policeman, PC Steve McGoff.

PC, McGoff, 40, was stabbed and slashed in the chest and left arm while arresting the suspect. Two off duty Territorial Support Group police constables who assisted in the arrest also received minor injuries.

Both stabbing victims were taken to Barnet General Hospital, where their injuries are not believed to be life threatening.

The 22-year-old suspect is now under arrest and is currently at a North West London Police Station.

Crash Scooter Stolen

Police called to the scene of an accident on the High Road on 21 July found that a vital piece of evidence had disappeared.

The Accident Investigation Unit told *THE ARCHER* that a witness reported seeing a motor-scooter driven off the pavement on to the road, at which point the rider lost control, crashing into a parked car. The rider fell off and the scooter then hit another car.

When police arrived, the scooter had been removed. It was later recovered, and was found to have been stolen. It

had a false number plate.

Life threatening

Because paramedics believed at the time that the rider's head injury could be fatal, the police cordoned off the area, in front of Willow Walk on the Grange Estate, for several hours to carry out necessary investigations. As it happened, the rider recovered, and was discharged from hospital the following day.
