## Irene Friedman: a Good Neighbour

A resident of Leslie Road for some forty years, was Irene Friedman who sadly passed away on 29 October, after struggling with cancer for five years.

Irene was born in Breslau in 1920, and spent her childhood in the Sudetenland (now divided between Germany, the Czech Republic, Slovakia and Poland). She lived through some of the 20th Century's more sordid moments of history. In 1938 her family collected money for her and her sister to escape the Nazis but they found themselves in Vienna exactly when the German army occupied Austria! She and her sister proceeded from one country to another until they arrived in England. Within a few months Irene joined the army, where she served until the end of World War II.

Irene ran school kitchens in London from then until she retired fifteen years ago, and was active in the Communist party the whole time. She was always interested in education (her own having been interrupted) and was one of the early proponents of the University of the Third Age. After the effective dissolution of the Communist Party, she joined the Labour Party and was in at the start of the women's movement. In fact it was typical of Irene that she always said that the Communist Party left her!

#### **Passionately committed**

Irene was also a passionate supporter of the East Finchley Community Festival, and was one of the longest serving volunteers. Along with her partner Muhith Gholam, she was involved in a wealth of other community and local interests including the Finchley Pensioners Rights, The Neighbourhood Centre, Long Lane ImprovementAssociation, Joint

Action Committee to Pensioners Rights, Barnet Pensioners, Stop the (North Circular) Road and the East Finchley Village Society, as well as being one of the first Tree Wardens at the age of 77.

It is not very often in life that one has the chance to encounter someone who has experienced so much, and yet retained their youthful interest in what was going on as well as a commitment to help others. Irene had these qualities in abundance, and was a link with some of the darkest moments of European history. Like the events she witnessed, she will be remembered for a long time.

George will be missed by many, he was often to be seen sitting on a bench in East End Road outside the Five Bells, enjoying the sunshine and having a chat with passers by.
