Homage to O'Henry

Part 2: A winter's tale, Fortis Green

I am seasonally reminded of the film Full House and O'Henry's poignant short story by a horse chestnut tree in the garden of 62 Fortis Green. In autumn the magnificent tree yields an abundance of fresh shiny brown, pungent smelling conkers that takes me back to my childhood and revives fond memories. In deepest winter, when the rest of the huge tree is bare, the leaves of one single branch steadfastly resist the merciless force of nature and refuse to yield and fall.

One night two years ago as I watched by the powerful light of the street lamp, the branch violently tossed and thrown about in the strong wind, I had a sudden inkling as to why those leaves clung on so tenaciously to life. The following day I took photographs of the tree so that I had visual proof. That last cluster of leaves, yellowed and brown, curled and fragile, eventually blew away or fell to the ground in January 2000 after days of vicious gale force winds and rainstorms.

Last winter I watched to see if the same phenomenon occurred. Sure enough, not a leaf on that branch budged. Fluttering bravely, they again defied the cold winter winds and heavy rains. It was weird, 'unnatural.'

Cocooned in light

A heavy fall of snow at Christmas finally proved too much for the leaves and laid the tree bare. But, after two winters of observing the tree. it confirmed for me the reason why the leaves on that solitary branch survive for so long. During the day the cluster of leaves responded to the pale winter daylight, while in the evening and at night, illuminated by the powerful street lamp, they were warmed and kept alive long after all the others had fallen. It is as if that small cluster of leaves existed in a cocoon of constant, life-affirming sunlight.

I have a truly great short story writer, O'Henry, to thank for bringing this miracle to my attention. For, had I not seen the films Full House and The Last Leaf which so captured my imagination, I doubt I would have taken any notice of what was happening on that conker tree on Fortis Green.
