High Road hole promotes vandalism

A month ago a hole was dug in the pavement in the High Road on behalf of an electricity company who appear to be upgrading the supply to a flat adjacent to Stewart-Duncan opticians shop.

For some reason, they seem unable to complete the job, and the hole has remained open. Not surprisingly, it has started to fill up with rubbish, including an old car wheel, and is rapidly becoming a real eyesore.

John Kozul, owner of the opticians, said that bricks extracted

from the hole and stacked nearby, have been used to smash up the front of the shop next door, and is concerned that further vandalism might take place if this work remained outstanding much longer.

He pointed to a large piece of steel water pipe, lying by

the side of the hole; an ideal weapon for a vandal, and complained that he regularly has to clean the mud and the sand from the pavement outside his shop, that blows over from the spoil heap. Barnet Council are conspicuous by their absence from this.
