This summer, Hampstead Garden Suburb's Proms at St. Jude's celebrated its tenth anniversary. The Proms prides itself on presenting a range of concerts by local and internationally distinguished artists and some of the country's young prodigies.

From 15 to 23 June highlights of the week commemorated the centenary of the birth of the British Composer Sir William Walton, and the BBC Concert Orchestra's 50th anniversary. Performers included the Phoenix Concert Band with members of Brooklands Junior School, soloist and cellist Ralph Kirschbaum, BBC's Young Musician of the Year Danny Driver and Radio 3 Presenter and Best Vocalist of the British Jazz Awards Stacey Kent and many others.

But the concerts, in the beautiful, historical setting of Central Square, are not simply for entertainment. The Prom's aim is to raise funds for charity. This year the committee hopes to beat last year's

figure of £19,000. Threequarters will go to a charity in Toynbee Hall, created by the suburb's founder Dame Henrietta Barnett in East London to give disadvantaged young people opportunities and the remainder to the North London Hospice, which cares for the terminally ill. The Proms is intended for everyone and this year consisted of eight evening plus seven free lunchtime performances.

Susie Gregson of Sponsor-

ship, Advertising and PR, said: "This year's Proms has even more high profile concerts than previous years." But not forgetting the true philanthropic spirit of the programme, and delighted that last year's funds enabled some children to go on summer camps, she added: "We hope that through our free lunchtime concerts we encourage everyone to come. We've had local disabled people and
