Memorial to Valentine

14 October is the copy deadline for the November issue. Nobody knows his actual resting-place, but he now has a commemorative plaque in the funeral chapel.

The story of the VC who was stripped of his medal and committed suicide in Pentonville Prison was told in *THE ARCHER* last year, but it was Barnet Archivist Andrew Mussell who first brought it to light locally with a talk in East Finchley Library. In 1863, Bambrick - a 26 year-old honoured for "conspicuous bravery" - marked his last night in the Army by a fight with another soldier. He is said to have been protecting a woman from a beating, but the other man, whose medals disap-

peared after the fight, accused him of assault and robbery.

That was the version his trial

judge chose to believe, attributing Bambrick's behaviour to drink, and he was not inclined to be lenient. Bambrick lost his VC and his pension, and was sentenced to three years penal servitude. After only three months he hanged himself.

Mrs Didy Grahame of the VC and GC Association, whose research uncovered the story, told *THE ARCHER* that he was not the only VC to suffer traumas and reversals of fortune, which were not understood at the time. She believes that the judge was unsympathetic, though Bambrick's attitude in court didn't help him.

A heroic fighter

General Wallace, from his old regiment, agreed. "I suspect he was a typical rifleman - sometimes unhappy with orders, but dour and tenacious. We want to remember him as a heroic fighter, and forget the rest. It's doubtful whether he would have been found guilty today."

Half a century later, George V ruled that a VC could never be taken away - even on the scaffold, but that was too late for Bambrick. When he was sentenced, he said, "It is of no consequence what you do now... I don't care what you do with me".

What would he have thought of last month's ceremony, attended by Islington's Mayor and Barnet's Deputy Mayor, as well as the military?

Derek Warren of the Finchley Society, who helped lead the campaign to recognise him, said simply, "It was really rather touching". It was suggested from the floor that this should be maintained and used as a museum and archive centre.
