Defending yourself against burglars

On 1 February, guidance on the use of force by householders against intruders was jointly published by the Crown Prosecution Service and the Association of Chief Police Officers.

The main points are:

*Wherever possible you should call the police.

*Anyone can use reasonable force to protect themselves or others, to carry out an arrest or to prevent crime. You are not expected to make fine judgements over the level of force you use in the heat of the moment.

*As a general rule, the more extreme the circumstances and the fear felt, the more force you can lawfully use in self-defence.

*If you are in your own home and in fear for yourself or others, the law does not require you to wait to be attacked before using defensive force yourself.

*If you have acted in reasonable self-defence, and the intruder dies you will still have acted lawfully.

*However, if, for example, having knocked someone unconscious, you then decided to hurt them further to punish them, or if you knew of an intended intruder and set a trap to hurt or to kill them rather than involve the police, you would be acting with very excessive and gratuitous force and could be prosecuted.

*If someone runs off and you give chase you are no longer acting in self-defence and so the

same degree of force may not be reasonable. However, you are still allowed to use reasonable force to recover your property and to make a citizen's arrest.
