No drinking fountain allowed

The Friends of Cherry
Tree Wood have launched
a campaign to reinstall a
drinking fountain in the
playground in the park.

Hundreds of children use the playground every week but there are no drinking facilities when the café is not open.

However, campaigners have been advised by Barnet Council that no fountain will be possible under health and safety regulations.

The Friends of Cherry Tree Wood were hoping that Three Valleys Water would help to fund a drinking fountain following the installation of their pumping station in the park earlier this year. However, this would first need Barnet's approval.

There are drinking fountains in Highgate Wood and Hampstead Heath but these parks are managed by the Corporation of London.

There used to be a drinking fountain in Cherry Tree Wood and the pipes may still be underneath the tarmac near the east fence of the playground.

At the East Finchley Festival last month, pages of signatures were collected on a petition in favour of a drinking fountain for the playground.

Don't forget your Health Card

When travelling to Europe from this year on, you need to pack your EHIC.

The European Health Insurance Card, which replaces all previous documents, entitles you to reduced cost (or sometimes free) healthcare in countries belonging to the European Economic Area and also Switzerland. It entitles you to the same treatment as people living in the country you are visit-

ing. However, you are still advised to take out travel insurance.

Protect your car against crime

Barnet Police need your help to reduce car crime in Barnet. Much crime could be reduced if people took some easy, simple steps to make their cars and vehicles less appealing to opportunist thieves.

Always lock the door and close the windows of your car when you leave it, even for a short space of time. This includes going to the kiosk to pay for your petrol at a garage.

Especially in summer, remember to close all windows when leaving the car, even the sunroof. Never leave anything on display in the car - jackets or bags can be very appealing to thieves. If you have to leave items make sure they are put in the boot and if the contents of the boot are visible make sure they are covered over

or take the items with you. Never keep your car documents in the car. If the car is stolen, these vital papers make it easy for the thief to sell it on. Keep your car keys safe at home and never leave them visible or near to the door or window. Thieves will break into your home just to steal the car keys, especially if you own a high-value car. Look at your home security. How many of you keep the lawnmower and old pots of paint in the garage and the expensive car on the
