# **Two sentenced** over man's death


Two East Finchley men have been sentenced to lengthy jail terms for the killing of Colin Browne on The Grange Estate in April 2006.

Warm weather warning

Barnet Police are emphasising that residents need to be more cautious about leaving exterior doors and windows open and unlocked. Whenever the house is unoccupied, exterior doors should be locked and all ground floor windows should be closed and locked if possible. When residents are at home, care should be taken to ensure that all ground floor windows are closed and where possible locked before retiring for the night.

Detective Inspector Afiz Khan said: "It is a very important message: don't

Barnet Trading Standards Authority has also warned that lottery scams, where victims are informed they have won huge amounts of money in overseas lotteries they have never entered, are reappearing in greater number. Again, the method has changed in that the fraudsters do not ask for cash up front, but wait until a subsequent stage of the claim process. Be aware that they are all scams.

Aaron Gordon, aged 20, of Oak Lane, N2 was found guilty of murder and sentenced to life imprisonment with a recommendation to serve a minimum of 30 years. He was also sentenced to 10 years imprisonment for possession of a firearm with intent, to run concurrently. Lamont Emesibe, aged 20, of Long Lane, was found guilty of manslaughter and sentenced to 12 years imprisonment. Their trial took place at the Old Bailey.

Mr Browne, aged 38, of Leyton, was found dead on a patch of ground on The Grange. He had suffered several stab wounds and had been shot.

It is believed he was killed in a confrontation after travelling to the estate to find those who, in an earlier incident, had attacked someone he knew.
