Airspace relief

The threat of more aircraft
in the crowded skies over
East Finchley has been
lifted, following the government's recent rejection of plans to increase
traffic.

Many local authorities including Barnet Council had been alarmed at draft proposals by the National Air Traffic Services (Nats) to allow more planes to fly over north London to Heathrow, with the prospect of more noise, worsening air quality and potential safety risks. Currently, seven flight paths involving airports in the south-east of England already affect those living in the N2 postcode area.

While the British Airports Authority plans for a third runway at Heathrow were approved earlier this year, Secretary of State for transport Geoff Hoon has rejected proposals which would have meant planes flying every three to four minutes.

However, if the third runway is built at Heathrow, there will be substantially more aircraft over north London, which would require a significant re-design at the airport to accommodate additional growth.

Crossover crossed off

Last December THE ARCHER reported that many local residents were objecting to a proposal for a pavement crossover in Summerlee Avenue. It was scheduled for an area that can get particularly busy, due to its proximity to Cherry Tree Wood.

The objectors felt that cars exiting from the off-street parking would be a danger, especially to children running along the pavement on their way to or from the Wood. They also feared it would spoil the look of the place and set a precedent, encouraging others to construct crossovers where none exist at present.

On the case

Despite a petition with a large number of signatures being presented, the driveway was approved by Barnet Council's Highways section. So, a group of residents took their cause to the Finchley and Golders Green Area Sub Committee, presenting them with related health and safety issues as well as querying possible policy and procedural problems. They also highlighted the fact that the views of the statutory public consultation had been ignored.

A unanimous cross-party vote by the councillors present resulted in the case being referred back for review to the Director of Transport and Environment in Barnet. This review took two months.

However, after five months of campaigning the objectors finally learned that the decision to allow a crossover had been overturned. One of the objectors told *THE ARCHER* that it had not been easy, but hoped that the victory would give confidence to others wishing to oppose crossovers in their area.
