## Stirring Russian vespers

With courage, daring and devotion, the Finchley Choral Society sang in Russian, unaccompanied, at the Free Church in Hampstead Garden Suburb on 14 March.

Initiating these risks was the choir's new director Grace Rossiter. Firm, resolute and vigorous, she supervised the beat, the pitch, and the ardour. Louise Jones had coached the authentic Russian pronunciation.

I was much moved by this rarely-played masterpiece, enjoying the beauty of the Russian language and the rich texture of Rachmaninov's harmonisation of age-old Slav liturgical melodies. The choir sang beautifully and securely, with enthusiasm and deep respect. Some of the singers had to wipe away tears after singing the Slavonic version of Ave Maria.

Liturgical pieces by other Russian composers were interpersed among the Vespers. Two came from Tchaikovsky, Rachmaninov's inspiration and model for this church music. Chesnokov's Svéte Tihiy, for women's voices, was exquisite, serene and intricate. With clear, pure, resonant voices, befitting a Russian church, Catherine Hopper, mezzo-soprano, and Ed Goster, tenor, elevated an already stirring performance. On the organ, Richard Harvey gave us a crowd-like Toccata by Mushel and some splendour on B-A-C-H (Liszt).

### You cannot be serious

Don't go and see the latest art show at artsdepot in North Finchley if you want to spend an undemanding hour or two gazing appreciatively at art.

Seriously...? is a demandingly complex and thought provoking exhibition that explores how sincerity is portrayed in contemporary film and performance.

It features the work of artists who play with different ways of being sincere about serious subjects, such as identity, sexuality and cultural heritage. Their methods are unsettling, often deliberately overturning the usual relationship between performer and audience.

For example, Laura Kuch's film Talking about this work for 1 hour, 2 minutes and 27 seconds shows her trying to convince us of her true intentions in making the film. But we cannot hear a word she is saying because the film is

ing, Harold Offeh plays both actor and narrator, responding with inertia to an enthusiastic voiceover providing practical suggestions on looking after body and mind. His deadpan response demonstrates the banality of the clichéd advice.
