# **Review: Covent Garden Chamber Orchestra** By Ken Carter

On a cold Saturday in March, a concert at St Michael's Church in Highgate brought warmth to all those privileged to attend. The Covent Garden Chamber Orchestra (CGCO) comprises trained musicians, full of life, yet not full-time professionals. They put on three concerts a year, with rewarding enthusiasm.

Beethoven's 8<sup>th</sup> Symphony catches him in unbuttoned mood but tearing with energy, nevertheless. There are four fast, active movements and each one is riotous. The CGCO, duly vigorous, didn't quite catch on until the last movement, where they hit the right tempo for Beethoven's exuberant joke-making.

Then, together with Nicola Eimer, a local musician deservedly gaining high repute, we switched to the hectic atmosphere and high jinks of Shostakovich's 2<sup>nd</sup>

We also have our regular Silent Film event on 31 May with Fritz Lang's classic *Metropolis*. With live piano by Stephen Horne, this is a wonderful afternoon of cinema.
