Four men were arrested for burglary in Creighton Avenue on 15 February. PC Eddie Rose, who made

PC Eddie Rose, who made the arrests, became suspicious when he saw the men eyeing up the houses on the avenue. The men were unaware they were being watched as the police officer was in plain clothes and driving an unmarked car. When PC Rose spotted the men emerging from a back garden he arrested them, with help from

other members of the Safer Neighbourhood Team. They have all been bailed pending further enquiries.
