## Appeal for help after two attempted child abductions

Police are appealing for help following what appear to be two attempted abductions of children that took place

The first incident happened on Saturday 12 June in Avenue House Park, East End Road, at about 4.30pm. An eight year old boy was playing with friends out of the direct sight of the supervising adults when he was approached by an unknown man who grabbed his arm and pulled him away, dragging him along for about 30 feet until he managed to struggle free.

The man is described as white, 30-40 years old, average build with short dark hair, 5'6 - 5'10 tall, clean shaven and wearing dark trousers and a hooded red top under a short denim jacket.

### Woman driver foiled

The second incident happened near Highgate tube station at about 8.10am on Wednesday 16 June. A 12year-old girl was walking along Shepherds Hill, near the junction with Stanhope Road, when a car pulled up beside her. The driver, described as a white woman in her 50s with blonde hair, told the girl to get into the car.

The girl refused to get in, despite repeated instructions from the driver. A member of the public, described as a white man, intervened and told the girl to run to safety. The driver stayed in the car and at no point made any threats or used any force.

### Car chase ends in two arrests

A police car chase that began in Colindale in the early hours of 19 June came to a dramatic end in East Finchley when two men were arrested for stealing a car.

"I was woken at about 5am by a police helicopter and shouting in the street," said a resident of Leslie Road. "When I looked out of the window I saw a man lying on the pavement in handcuffs, surrounded by police and a police dog."

Police responded quickly to a report that a black Ford Fiesta was being stolen in Percy Road, Colindale. They got there in time to see the car speed out of Percy Road into the High Road. They chased it, signalling to the driver to stop, but he ignored them.

The driver raced to East Finchley, turning into Park Gate, next to Leslie Road. The driver leapt out of the car when he realised it was a cul de sac, followed by the passenger. They tried to escape by running down The Walks but were captured in Leslie Road Both were bitten by a police dog.

The men were arrested for stealing the car and failing to stop. The driver was also charged with drinking and driving and the passenger for allowing himself to be carried in a stolen car.

## Warning over security alarm scam

Barnet Boroughwatch has issued a warning about a telephone scam being used to trick householders into buying over-priced security alarms. Cold calling is said to be happening in this area now.

The method allegedly being used by SAS Fire and Security is to get a company called Crime Research UK to call vou. They ask you to take part in some crime research and claim to be working with the police, Neighbourhood Watch and the Home Office, which is

They then inform you that crime has gone up in your area. They claim to be giving away four free alarm systems and that you are one of the winners. If you accept, SAS subsequently calls you to arrange the instal-

But the alarm isn't free. Instead it is paid for by a big installation fee and vastly inflated monthly 'monitoring' charges. Victims, many of them elderly, have forked out thousands. One couple paid £7,220 for an eight-year deal, which should have cost nearer £1,600.

A local resident who was contacted in East Finchley was told they'd won a free alarm as part of Barnet Crime Prevention week, but there is no such thing.
