# **Kebab shops and speed cameras** of East Finchley

The Bishops Avenue has constant builders, the Great North Road is still known for its Highwaymen and famous Radio 1 DJ Judge Jules lives just south of Fortis Green - all according to a new map of N2.

These personal takes on East Finchley are by artist Stephen Walter, who has redrawn every inch of Greater London for his monumental artwork The Island. Other details he chose to include after tramping local streets were the pubs and kebab shops on the High Road, some of our allotments, plus Coldfall Wood and

the 20mph zone in Church Lane, even though residents are still campaigning to get it installed.

Instead of houses in The Bishops Avenue, Walter represents the mansion-like properties with a row of pound signs. Budgens is represented as a supermarket trolley, there's the ATM at the station, and he even pinpoints

speed cameras on the A1.

To see The Island in all its full-size glory, along with a collection of other maps from British History, visit the Magnificent Maps exhibition at the British Library, Euston, open seven days a week until 19 September. Admission is free.

Their first meeting, in April, was at the home of a collector of Dutch Masters and some more modern works, but the host needs only to be interested in art.

Families eager for a free day in the open air flocked to Alexandra Palace Park on Saturday 5 June. This BBC Springwatch Wild Day Out helped to launch Haringey's Green Week.

The range of stalls and activities was amazing. A BioBlitz, using the wider areas of the park, was described as 'a huge wildlife hunt against the clock' and drew on the expertise of Natural History Museum scientists. Throughout the day there were presentations in the Show Tent on, for example, making ponds; saving sparrows; supporting bees; spotting urban raptors.

The Friends of Coldfall Wood were kept busy at their stall all day, presided over by Miss Dinky D., an awesome tarantula (caged). The other main activity was more hands-on for everyone: making 'pooters' for catching tiny insects humanely. All you needed was a small plastic jar with two holes in the lid, drinking straws, scraps of gauze and plasticine, grains of rice, oh yes and some patience and dexterity. Children went away with their pooters, delighted by the simple but magical experience of gently sucking up a rice grain 'bug'.

The Friends also made sure that adult visitors to the stall received information about the wood and its neighbour, Muswell Hill Playing Field, so with luck there'll be lasting interest and involvement from many more North Londoners.
