Mixed picture on crime rates in Barnet

Barnet has seen significant falls in the levels of hate crimes and crimes involving serious violence but burglary and robbery rates are both up.

Serious violent incidents fell by 29% in Barnet over the last year. "In this crime category, Barnet is the safest borough in London," said a police spokesperson.

Police have issued the latest crime figures covering the 12 months to March 2010. They show that there have also been large falls in racist and other hate crime(down 33.6%), homophobic offences (down 30%) and domestic violence (down 10.2%).

In addition, the most recent police survey of residents' perception of levels of anti-social behaviour (December 2009) revealed that 85% were confident that the police were dealing with the things that matter most to them. Car crime was also down with 17% fewer cars stolen and 12.5% fewer car break-ins.

The bad news

But there were increases in some crimes. Rape was up by 164% "Most of the increase in

reported rapes are allegations going back more than two years," said a police spokesperson. "However, there is still a year on year increase of 31%."Gun crime also increased, by 12.3%. Robbery against the person was up by 7.4%.

The biggest increase in the number of additional offences was burglary, up by 485 more offences (12.8%). Police have been working on a prevention campaign, distributing thousands of timer switches. They've set up the Street-a-Week initiative, which tackles issues identified by local residents. Safer Neighbourhood Teams are actively giving out crime prevention advice.

"We are committed to major improvements in our continuing war against burglars, robbers, and especially those who would threaten and injure our youth," said Borough Commander Chief Superintendent Neil Basu.

Londoners were asked to cast their vote in an online poll, run by Smooth Radio in conjunction with Allinlondon.co.uk. Beating off stiff competition from other London venues such as Soho Theatre and Stratford Circus, artsdepot, a multi-art form venue that opened in 2004, took home

the Best Neighbourhood Theatre award for the second year in a row.

Voters described artsdepot as a "state of the art venue with a warm and inviting atmosphere", and "a gem of a theatre with a diversity of different acts: everything here for young and old".
