Helen O'Toole. Father Laurence Hill, who had known Helen since she was a toddler, came out of retirement to conduct the service in the church and later at Marylebone Crematorium, East End Road. Helen's primary school head teacher Sonia Singham played the accompanying music.

Helen lived for most of her life in Trinity Road. She was born with a very rare condition known as Morquio Disease and tribute must be paid to her parents Mary and Charles for the strength of love and support they gave which enabled Helen to develop into such an amazing young person.

Despite her condition, Helen attended mainstream school at Holy Trinity Primary before going on to a support unit at Whitefields Secondary School. At 18, Helen went to Treloars College in Hampshire. Here she was introduced to wheelchair dancing, which was to play such a large part in her life.

Helen also got a taste for independence and was delighted when she was eventually able to move into her own flat in N3 a couple of years ago. She was able to decorate it according to her own considerable artistic talents.



Though Helen needed 24 hour support, she was independent, feisty and knew what she wanted. Many of her mourners felt that what Helen achieved against all the odds in her short life is truly an inspiration to others.

Helen was an active member of the community, being involved for instance with organizing the East Finchley Festival, getting disabled access to the library and helping as a volunteer at Holy Trinity School. She was also a great fan of THE ARCHER and used to write for us.
