Mentors show the way

Volunteers are being sought to take part in an innovative project designed to help mentor people with learning disabilities in how to use public buses safely.

The Going Places scheme will see volunteers with learning disabilities given training which allows them to pass on their travel skills to others living with similar disabilities. Barnet Mencap, which is running the project, is looking to recruit as many as 12 Volunteer Travel Assistants. The pilot stage of the scheme was supported by Barnet Council's Community Support Team and is being funded by the Metropolitan Police's Safer Travel Team. The volunteers will be aged 18

or over and will already be able to use public transport confidently. Potential mentors will be given training in how to use public transport safely, and support in areas such as improving their communication skills and asking for directions. They will then be matched with someone looking to build up the skills and confidence needed to get about the borough independently.
