

A sense of space

Avril Macdonald's new exhibition of prints and artwork is called Seeking Space, a clever play on the urges and constraints that characterise her distinctive work. Avril has exhibited at the Phoenix and at All Saints' Church in Durham Road, but her latest exhibition is at The Haberdashery, 22 Middle Lane, Crouch End, from 19 August

to 18 September.

Last autumn, her print of trees in Cherry Tree Wood won the Visitors' Choice award at the Islington Arts Society exhibition. Avril's lyrical, slightly melancholy images of trees in silhouette or of twilight woods ("fox-time") have immediate appeal, especially for people who recognise her north London settings.

Wilder settings in her native Scotland have been the stimulus for Avril's prints of islands (the North Uist series) and of sheep, fish creels and even wire, with striking patterns creating abstract shapes rooted in the natural world.

Welcoming the accidental

Avril enjoys solitary walking ("one of life's great luxuries") and atmospheric weather. The strange skies after the 2005 Bunsfield fire, for example, provided her with remarkable photos and, later, prints. "I like the accidental," Avril says, "and I look for strong shapes.'

That sense of shape and pattern was influenced by studying textile design at art school and by a lifelong interest in photography. A career in journalism and PR took her in another direction but in recent years, through courses at the Institute with Barbara Jackson and Theresa Pateman, and with encouragement from Tark Butler and David Aaronson, she has found her 'voice' as an artist.

Sally Wood, who lives near Alexandra Palace, has a passion for the place. She told The Archer, "I want to make it a people's palace." That's the story behind her Cakewalk **Revival in Ally Pally's spectacular Palm Court.**

The Revival events are tea dances featuring swing and ragtime. One fan who sampled a recent session said: "The joint was jumping. Be there."

LPs and pre-war swing records conjure up the '20s and '30s, when Alexandra Palace was pioneering television, and the live swing and ragtime jazz band brings happy back memories of the

1970s. Sally says, "So many people have told me about the Sunday jazz sessions here at that time"

She told us that over 100 people have been turning up at events to join in the fun. "Lots are vintage dancers, and some wear vintage dress, but it's designed for everyone. We have people from nought to 90-odd. One lady of 95 loves to be on the dance-floor, and we have a treasure hunt with prizes for children at the same time."

You can be at Cakewalk Revival on the last Sunday of every month. It gets going at



5.30, and you can jitterbug on until 10.30pm. As well as live piano, vocals, LPs and the band, there's sometimes the chance of beginners' swing dance lessons. The bar and kitchen are available until 9pm.
