Machete attack on the High

## Road

By Janet Maitland A vicious fight erupted on the High Road at about 12.30pm on Monday 3 October. Passers-by were horrified to witness three men, one armed with a hammer and one with a machete, attack a fourth

man in front of the KFC

takeaway restaurant. Several people rang the police who arrived quickly but just after the three attackers got into a silver car and sped away. The victim fled down Kitchener Road. Police searched neighbouring streets looking for him, but couldn't find him.

The men were all white and in their twenties. Images of the armed men have been caught on CCTV. One wore a grey shirt and grey shorts, another a black shirt and black shorts, and the third a black jacket and trousers.

"The victim has not yet made himself known to us," said PC Eddie Rose of the Safer Neighbourhood Team. "If anyone took down the car registration number, or has any information, please ring on 020 7161 9014, or, if they want to remain anonymous, please call 0800 555 111."

Climb every mountain: Amanda on the trail in Peru

Amanda, of Richmond Road, will embark on the ultimate ten-day challenge in February 2012 in aid of the Alzheimer's Society and she's hoping to drum up plenty of support.

At 19,345 ft (5,895m) Mount Kilimanjaro in Tanzania is higher than Everest base camp. At that height there is only 50% of the normal amount of oxygen, so it will be the toughest challenge she has ever undertaken.

Amanda says: "The statistics are scary; 33% of people attempting the ascent don't make it to the summit plus there are between 10-15 fatalities per year. So I don't know if I will reach the top, but I'm determined to try my hardest and in the process raise lots of money

for the Alzheimer's Society." Each year 100,000 people will develop dementia. Many people are worried about their memory, but don't know what to do about it. Others know they have dementia, but have no support. By raising money for the Alzheimer's Society, Amanda will be helping to provide more support for carers and for people with dementia, as well as joining the fight to find a cure.
