This month marks the second anniversary of two community projects launched by East Finchley Baptist Church in November 2009.

A community survey undertaken by the church in 2009 identified the need for more toddler group provision within East Finchley, leading to the Little Fishes baby & toddlers group being established

Little Fishes meets on Friday mornings at the church, from 9.30am-11.15am, for parents, carers and children from 0-3 years. The cost is £2.00 per session and the group is run by church members.

The second community initiative was the establishment of an English language class for speakers of other languages, which started on the Grange estate but now meets at the church.

The language teaching is provided for beginners through to intermediate level. Classes are completely free, and run by volunteers from the church for one hour on Wednesday evenings from 5.30-6.30pm.
