Beauty treatment safety in Barnet

Almost all procedures taking place in the borough's beauty salons must be covered by a special treatment licence from Barnet Council. Its purpose is to make sure that the treatments, equipment and premises are safe and properly managed, and that practitioners are fully qualified.

Councillor Melvin Cohen, Cabinet Member for Governance and Civic Affairs, said: "The licensing scheme protects our residents from the risk of injury or of catching infections such as hepatitis. Barnet Council considers it a serious offence to practise without a licence, and doing so can result in the Council undertaking a prosecution. The maximum fine for trading without a licence is £2,500. Each safety offence can be fined up to £20, 000 in the Magistrates' Court, or unlimited fine and / or up to two years'

imprisonment in the Crown Court

All licensed businesses should exhibit their licence at all times, where it can easily be seen by everyone using the premises. Practitioners who are uncertain whether they require a licence, and any members of the public wanting to know whether a business has a licence, should contact the Council's Environmental Health Team on 020 8359 7995 for help or information.
