Then Cllr Robert Rams surprised everyone by making Community Barnet (the former Barnet Voluntary Services Council) the building's licensee, asking them to support community organisations who want to make "right to bid" proposals for the library. He cited

On 1 February, Barnet the success of the community-Council obtained an order run HGS library, set up last year, when Friern Barnet's bid for a similar arrangement was refused. Saying that Barnet is now better off financially, Cllr Rams stated they had "the scope to look favourably on bids for the building from local residents".

Friern Barnet campaigner Keith Martin told *The Archer*: "I imagine that we shall see if we have common ground with Community Barnet, and discuss the situation with them". He hopes that the books (donated by the public) will be left on the shelves, believing that "the occupation has increased the value of the building as a going concern to a potential user who wants it to continue to function

as a library".
