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Business support for the over-50s

A national enterprise charity is planning to host a series of workshops and courses in East Finchley to help aspiring mature entrepreneurs set up their own businesses.

The Prince's Initiative for Mature Enterprise (PRIME) received funding from Barnet Council in 2013 as part of £220,000 worth of finance across 13 local projects to improve the skills of local residents over 50 in financial matters.

A workshop will be held at East Finchley Library on Friday 24 January, covering self-employment, enterprise techniques and how to develop a business idea.

For those seeking further training and who want to start 2014 embarking on a new direction in life or a change in career, PRIME will be holding a more comprehensive business training course on 7 February,

also at the library.

The training course includes three classroom days, spread over six weeks, covering the building blocks essential to any start-up business, including marketing, accounting and how to write a business plan.
