What connects one of the most famous bands of the 1980s with a chemist's in East Finchley? The answer is a lady called Helen Mikellides, who works in Cootes Pharmacy and lives on Leslie Road.

Life-long Style Council fan, Helen, sent a chance email to tribute band, the Style Councillors, which resulted in her being recruited as their lead female

The only Style Council tribute act in the world, the Style Councillors have been going for four months. As well as Helen, their ten-strong line-up includes Darren Fletcher, who sings in the Paul Weller tribute act The Weller Experience.

### Sounds of the 80s return

Their reception by fans and music lovers has been overwhelmingly positive. "It's been beyond our wildest dreams," Helen told *THE ARCHER*. "The Style Council were very popular. Their records outsold The Jam by three to one and they have a lot of die-hard fans.

The band has been working hard at replicating the sound of the originals. "We spent ages getting the sounds exactly right," said Helen.

The Style Council was formed in 1983 by Paul Weller after The Jam broke up, and continued until 1989. Two members of the original band, singer Dee C. Lee and drummer Steve White, have already expressed their support for the tribute band. Paul Weller himself has yet to comment.

### See them live

The Style Councillors' first gig, at the Brentford Theatre in July, was a sell-out success. The next gig, their second, will be at the Jazz Café in Camden on 21 September.

Future plans include gigs in the north of England, while interest has been expressed in the US and Japan, where the Style Council had a big following back in the 1980s.
