## Man attacked on bus

A man travelling on a 134 bus from Muswell Hill had his nose broken in an unprovoked attack on 12 February. The 36-year-old man was assaulted from behind while the bus was travelling down Muswell Hill Road at about 11pm.

The assailant then got off and ran towards Archway Road. The injured man was taken to a north London hospital where he was later discharged.

The suspect is described as a black man, 30-35 years old, wearing dark clothes and a black beanie hat. He had deep scars across his nose and cheek.

# **Cannabis** grower

Etherton pleaded guilty to producing a class B drug when he appeared at Hendon Magistrates Court in January. He was sentenced on 23 February to a 12-month community supervision order with a drug rehabilitation requirement. He must also pay costs of £85 and a victim surcharge of £60.

# How to deal with bogus callers By Janet Maitland

"Just because a stranger at your door says they're from your water or gas company, the council, or even the police, it doesn't necessarily mean that they are," says PC John Kenny from the Safer Neighbourhood Team (SNT).

"Remember: even unknown youngsters who say they're looking for a lost pet, or think their football's in your garden, may just be trying to distract you."

Lock up and check up

Keep back and front doors locked, even when you're at home. If someone calls at your door, look through a window or spy hole to identify them. If you don't recognise them, either call "Who is it?" through the door, or put the door chain or door bar on first before opening the door. Keep it on while talking

Ask for an identity card and check it carefully, even if the caller has a pre-arranged appointment. If you're not sure, don't let the caller hurry or pressurise you. Just ask them to wait outside while you confirm who they are and then close the door and lock it. A genuine caller won't mind you doing this.

Don't ring any telephone number that the caller has given you. Instead, use directory enquiries or a telephone directory or Google to find the number of the company the caller claims to be from. If the caller(s) say they are the police, call the police on the non-emergency number 101 to confirm this or, if you're frightened, call the police on the emergency 999 number to check if the callers actually are the police.

#### **Basic precautions**

Do not open the door unless you are 100% sure the caller is who they say they are and you feel comfortable letting them into your home.

"Please ask your readers to tell family, friends and neighbours, especially older people, about these precautions," says PC Kenny. "Review their security as if it was your own home."
