Old Barn to be demolished

By Janet Maitland Barnet Council has announced that it plans to demolish the Old Barn in Tarling Road and replace it with a two-storey community centre.

The original plan was to refurbish the centre and build a new wing intended primarily for the Somali Bravanese community, whose centre on Coppetts Road, Muswell Hill, was burnt down in a racist arson attack in June 2013.

Consultation over local

space. There were also concerns about creating what were effectively two community centres and thereby separating one part of the local community from another.

When it became clear that these issues remained unresolved, the council responded to a request for more consultation by employing its community liaison service to talk to local residents, the Big Local regeneration project, the Somali Bravanese Association and other key stakeholders.

council spokesperson said: "One side will be leased by the Somali Bravanese Association, as a replacement for their old facility and the other half will be for other lease holders. The design will allow facilities to be shared easily."

The new plans will also allow much of the existing adjacent green space to be retained and improved. "There are real opportunities to make that space much better for community use," said the spokesperson.
