East Finchley station was the penultimate meeting point for Walk the Talk 2015, the aim of which was 'to raise awareness of social policies that are leading to psychological distress'.

From 17 - 21 August psychologists, counsellors and clients walked 100 miles from the British Psychological Society's office in Leicester to their London HQ, with some sleeping rough overnight or camping out in fields. On the way they visited centres connected with homelessness, food poverty and affected by the benefits system.

Organiser Stephen Weatherhead, a clinical psychologist, told The Archer that all in all 62 people had taken part, with others joining en route from
