Hours, books and space all cut at library

Now we know what is in store for East Finchley Library. After more than two years of uncertainty over cost-cutting proposals, Barnet Council representatives visited last month to reveal their plans for the future of the Grade 2 listed building in the High Road and the library service so valued by our community.

Building changes

After next April, the existing computer room at the front of the library will become an area available for commercial use, as will the whole of the upper floor. Everywhere else is retained for library use.

There was confusion on the evening the plans were revealed as Barnet Council website diagrams on display were indicating this change correctly while accompanying text stated that the children's library would also be lost. I queried this, and, after a check, was told that the text

was wrong. The information was obviously printed from the Barnet Council website, but when I checked the site three days later the mistake had not been corrected.

As the building is Grade 2 listed, including the built-in book stacks and the counter, very few structural alterations can be made. Computers will be moved out of the front room and into the main body of the library, and the second of the two rooms opposite the children's library will be opened up.
