Strings attached Violinist Katya Popylanska, 24, reached the final of the **Tunbridge Wells International Music Competition on** Sunday 1 May. She came through the three-day preliminary rounds to reach the semi-finals on Saturday beating a field of more than 80 entrants from countries spread as far as

China and New Zealand.

Katya, who lives in East Finchley, is originally from Toronto, Canada and is part way through a Masters programme at the prestigious Guildhall School of Music and Drama, in London. She came joint second in the Strings section and described the Competition as "a wonderful experience".

A triple treat Review by Ken Carter

The excellent London Ripieno Singers and soloists performed at All Saints Church, Durham Road, N2, at the end of April.

We began the evening with Mary witnessing the dying of her son, followed by a bare, ecstatic setting of the mass progressing, after the interval, to a short requiem. That is, we heard the Stabat Mater of Josef Rheinberger, the Missa Choralis of Liszt and the Requiem Brevis of Geoffrey Hanson.

Rheinbergerwasaprolificlate 19th century composer. He began as an organist, before becoming conductor to the Munich Court. The Stabat Mater had a dignified sobriety, given weight by the rich organ commentary.

Liszt's Missa Choralis mass dates from 1865 when, aged 54, he received minor orders of the Roman Catholic church. The result was a distinguished, simple and heartfelt statement of belief, reaching sublime sonority in a soaring soprano, sung purely and ravishingly by an unidentified member of the Ripieno Society.

Geoffrey Hanson's Requiem Brevis was dignified and austere,

from the occasional awkward intervals which jauntily introduced a note of realism into the proceedings.

Among the 'other works' by Geoffrey Hanson, I particularly enjoyed the impishness of his setting of Osbert Sitwell's Orpheus and the mellow authority of his Soliloquy for organ.
