Man sought over indecent exposures

Police have issued this image of a man they want to speak to in connection with a series of indecent exposures on the bus network.

The first offence was on 7 March where a man indecently exposed himself to a woman waiting at the bus stop on Finchley Road, NW11, near the junction with Birnbeck Road.

On 24 March, police officers saw a man acting suspiciously at another bus stop on Finchley Road, near the junction with Addison Way, NW11, but he managed to run away from them.

Five days later a man was seen by police officers at the bus stop outside East Finchley station. As soon as he was spotted the man ran off. Police officers chased him down The Bishops Avenue to Lyttelton Road, where he ran round the back of Belvedere Court and disappeared.

The lawned area at the back of the resi-

dential flats is skirted by a long wooded gulley, at the bottom of which is a stream. Officers found two bed pillows by the stream which they believe were discarded by the man.
