A numerical tribute to George Michael

Singer songwriter George Michael was born on 25 June 1963 in Church Lane, N2, and died at the age of 53 on 25 December 2016 in Oxfordshire. Aziz Inan, a professor at the school of electrical engineering at the University of Portland, Oregon, US, with a fascination for number patterns, sent us this numerical tribute to one of his musical heroes:

1. The day number of Michael's birth and the day number of his death are each equal to 25.
2. Michael died at age 53 where 53 is the 16th prime number. Interestingly, the square of 16 equals 256, Michael's birth date, 25 June (25/6).

3. If numbers one to 26 are assigned to the letters of the English alphabet as A being 1, B being 2, C being 3, etc., the sum of the numbers assigned to the letters of George equals 57 where the prime factors of 57, namely 3 and 19, differ by 16.

4. Moreover, if 25/12/2016 (the day he died) is split as 2512 and 2016, the sum of these two numbers equals 16 times 283 where 283 is the 61st prime number where the reverse of 61 is also 16. Additionally, the difference of 2512 and 2016 equals 16 times the sum of 25 and 6, the day and month numbers of Michael's birth.

5. George's 53rd birthday was interesting because as indicated before, 53 is the 16th prime number where 16 square gives his birth date, 25/6.
6. 25 June 2017 marked Michael's 54th birthday where twice 54 yields 108 (George Michael).
7. Michael's 55th birthday next year will also be special since the prime factors of 55, namely 5 and 11, add up to 16 and again, 16 square yields 25/6.

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
