New housing from Finchley's oldest charity

Finchley Charities are building 16 new housing units on their Wilmott Close site at the northern end of East Finchley. The new building, which will include four disabled accessible units, will be available for occupation this summer. It will be called Octavia House, after National Trust founder Octavia Hill, who lived for a time in nearby **Brownlow Road.**

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All the homes will be available to rent to local people aged 55 and over, who can live independently and have limited financial resources.

Meeting community needs

Finchley Charities already provide 156 homes on three Finchley sites: Wilmott Close and Homefield Gardens in N2, and Pewterers' Court in N3. They also own the Fuel Land Allotments and the Ann Owens Centre, which is run by AgeUK Barnet. In addition, the Trustees give funding to community groups who fulfil the Charities' criteria, and often provide direct services to local people.

Founded in 1488, Finchley Charities say they have to adapt to the changing needs of the community. Last year the

Trustees appointed a new full time Chief Executive, replacing the outdated role of Clerk. She is Susan Faridi, a Barnet resident whose career has been in the charitable and housing sector. Responsible for ensuring the Charities work in "a modern, open and transparent way, whilst still providing good quality, well maintained housing and social support to those in need", she told us that she wants the organisation to play a full role in the East Finchley and wider Barnet community.

The Trustees welcome applications for housing in a Finchley Charities property. Applicants should fulfil the criteria of being 55 and over, able to live independently, and with limited financial means.

Spate of garage break-ins

Police have urged garage owners to ensure their properties are secured after break-ins at two locations in one weekend.

Four young males in a silver hatchback car used a spanner to force the doors on five garages in the Ballards Lane area of N3 on Saturday 14 January before being scared off by a resident.

The next day a male in his 30s was seen getting into a silver estate car outside a block of garages in East Finchley where it was later discovered that multiple garages had been broken into and power tools had been stolen.

East Finchley officer Jan Lovell said: "It is very likely to be the same suspects. If you see or hear people around garages, call the police and if you feel up to it try and make them aware that they have been seen without putting yourself at risk. Call out to a friend or shine a torch out of the window. And of course there are many types of additional locks and alarms that can be fitted to garages.'
