First-class theatre is never far

By Daphne Chamberlain Do you enjoy going to the theatre but find that travelling and access to West End theatres is difficult and expensive? Now could be the perfect time for you to experience a production by Finchley's Guild Players.

This company, founded in 1946, stages several productions a year. They rehearse and perform in N3, in a theatre which accommodates wheelchairs, and has step-free access.

Major spring and autumn productions include comedy, drama, thrillers and pantomime, and they are top quality. They also do a one-night summer show and, because of their association with the Methodist church, an Easter production.

However, it is not a 'religious' group. They were originally the drama group of the Wesley Guild, but their members, currently aged between 18 and 80, come from all parts of the community.

Stage history

What's more, company members built their theatre themselves. As they perform in the Finchley Methodist Church Hall on Ballards Lane, roughly halfway between Finchley Central and North Finchley, this may seem puzzling.

The answer to the puzzle is that during the Second World War, the church hall was one of many commandeered by the Government to be used as a 'British Restaurant' to provide cheap, off-the-ration food for working people. The part which became the kitchen was reinforced to bear the weight of industrial stoves and, after the war, the newly formed Guild Players converted the reinforced space into the basis for a stage.
