The group meets every Thursday during term time from 7.30pm to 9pm at St Mary's Church in the High Road, East Finchley. Their activities include computer coding, making items to sell for charity, learning about global issues, trying science experiments, Zumba and plenty of parties.

During the summer the group goes camping and has outings including ice skating, community service and the Big Gig concert at Wembley Arena.

Co-leader Toni said: "Some of our original Guides have just started university this September. It's an amazing feeling knowing that Girl Guiding was part of their journey there. Sometimes girls stay for a short time, but often they stay for years. This has meant that we usually have a long waiting list to join our unit, but we now have a number of spaces."
