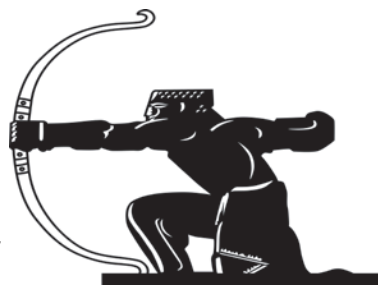

## Fire safety under review in all tower blocks

**Barnet Homes has sought to reassure residents of tower blocks in East Finchley following the Grenfell Tower fire last month in which at least 79 people are believed to have died.**

The arms-length organisation, which manages council housing on behalf of Barnet Council, said all blocks with communal areas were subject to regular fire safety inspections.

Any blocks with external cladding, thought to have been a factor in the Grenfell Tower fire, are being urgently re-inspected. East Finchley's three towers in Prospect Ring and Norfolk Close do not fall

into this category.

Prospect Ring resident Dermott Donnelly told *The Archer*: "The immediate response is that our building appears to be perfectly safe from a similar disaster. However, we are not experts and would expect Barnet Homes to inspect the buildings in Prospect Ring immediately, if only to put our minds at rest.

"All residents have recently

been required to have fireproof doors fitted to each individual flat, an expensive demand at the time,, but now? And there are fireproof doors between each floor. The building seems to be constructed throughout of brick and concrete which suggests that there would be little inflammable material at risk."

### Know the plan

The advice from London Fire Brigade for people who live in high rise properties or purpose-built flats and maisonettes, aside from having a working smoke alarm, is to make sure you know your escape plan.
