School to admit girls from 2018

Christ's College Finchley will increase the pool of available school places after confirming that it will welcome girls as well as boys from September 2018. The decision follows a consultation exercise with parents (*The Archer*, June 2017) which had more than 600 responses.

backed the school's proposal to go co-educational. Christ's College is currently undersubscribed so it is expected the admission of girls will widen choice for parents without affecting chances for boys to find a place too.

The move will come too late for pupils looking for school places this September. Entry to Year 7 this year will be boys only and all students currently in Years 7-10 will remain in boys-only classes up to Year 11, at which stage the school already admits girls to study for A-levels.

Parents and governors agree

Headteacher Samson Olusanya, who has pioneered the reforms, said: "The school will retain its determination to provide world class education

Nine out of 10 respondents for all students attending. The Governing Board and I are convinced that this decision will allow us to serve our local community most effectively and deliver the excellent education our current students deserve and which parents rightly expect."

The final decision as to whether the school's admissions can change will be taken by the Regional Schools Commissioner for London and the south east. Given the support of the Governing Board and parents, it is unlikely to be blocked.

The chronic shortage of secondary places in N2, N3 and NW10 has been highlighted in the last two years by the huge demand for admissions at the new Archer Academy in Eagans Place, East Finchley, and the response of Fortismere School in Muswell Hill, which last year expanded the size of its intake in years 7, 8 and 9

Two charged with murder at leisure park

Two men, both aged 21, have been charged with murdering 23-year-old Sevved Rasta Mir-Feyzi in the Great North Leisure Park off the High Road. Seyyed was allegedly assaulted in the car park during a fight involving a number of people at about 8.15pm on 31 May and shortly afterwards two men allegedly drove their car into him.

Police are appealing for the Old Bailey on 8 June and witnesses to the incident, or the events leading up to it, as it is believed that some people may have filmed it on their phones.

Detective Inspector John Marriott said, "I implore them to come forward. You could be holding the key to establishing the full circumstances of this young man's death."

The two men charged with his murder appeared at were remanded in custody. A provisional trial date has been set for 20 November. agility and strength.

The three coaches are all fully qualified, enhanced DBS (formerly Criminal Records Bureau) checked, insured and first aid trained. Their classes can accommodate up to 16 children and aim to be safe, fun and inspiring for the children as well as giving parents the bonus of a short break.

They are held at Heartlands High School, Station Road, Alexandra Palace, N22 7ST on Saturday afternoons for one hour during term time. Trial lessons are avail-
