## Free advice service is going strong

An independent advice service has been running at St Mary's Parish Centre in the High Road, N2, since last summer, thanks to a partnership between Grange Big Local and Citizens Advice Barnet. So what does it offer exactly?

Well, it's a free, confidential, impartial and independent service giving advice on issues such as benefits, tax credits and debt.

About one in ten enquiries in the opening months have related to utilities and about one in 20 have been to do with housing. In the run-up to Christmas, debt was the issue amongst more than a quarter of clients.

The service has so far recorded savings for local people of more than £14,000. A significant majority of clients are disabled or suffering from a long-term health condition.

One achievement by the

service was a successful challenge of the Department for Work and Pensions in incorrectly stopping Employment and Support Allowance to a resident. Another was getting the local authority to assess a person with housing needs and helping him to navigate all the red tape involved.
