

Man attacked and robbed of scooter by street gang

A man was assaulted and robbed of his scooter outside the tube station on Saturday 14 October at about 10pm. The 43-year-old victim was trying to ride his vehicle past a large group of youths when a few of them pushed him off it.

Some of the youths then street and then police outside Iceland," said one witness. Another said: "Five lads have just run past me on Kitchener Road with balaclavas and hoods up being chased by a police car. We'd only just carried our 13-week-old baby into the house." A third said: "Police have blocked off both ends of Beresford Road and brought in a dog unit."



Sainsbury's back to drawing board

It's nearly a year since planning consent was granted to Sainsbury's to open a convenience store on the corner of the High Road and Leicester Road, N2, but no outward progress seems to have been made. The two vacant stores there have stood empty for close on two years.

As previously reported in *The* Archer, the programme of works was more complicated than at first thought, hence the delay in opening. When we contacted Sainsbury's again in October a spokesman told us the company

was 'revisiting' its plans for the Local store in East Finchley.

He said: "We are continuing to develop our plans for a new convenience shop on the high street {sic}. Unfortunately we have had to revisit the works involved, as they are more detailed than we first thought. We are now working this through with our contractors and will be in a position to update the local community in the near future."
