"For a photographer it's an inspiring city in every sense and East Finchley has been the place that has connected me to it. Throughout my time here, I've been photographing its citizens, its life and its human relationships."

Photography has been Susana's hobby since she was 12 and she wants to make it her career. Next year, she plans to do a photography degree at Sunderland University and would then like to go freelance.
