Use as five self-contained flats.

First Floor Maisonette, 385 Long Lane N2

Roof extension involving rear dormer window to facilitate loft conversion.

Crossways, 26 The Bishops Avenue N2

Variation to planning permission dated 23/03/2017. Amendments include revised internal layout at basement and ground levels, reduced basement, omission of lightwells, alterations to fenestration, and inclusion of roof

top plant.

6 Trinity Avenue N2

Roof extension involving hip to gable, rear dormer window and two front rooflights, to facilitate loft conversion. Single-storey side/rear extension following demolition of existing rear extension. New decking area. First-floor rear extension.

11 Bancroft Road, N2

Certificate of Lawfulness for hip to gable extension.

44 Bancroft Road, N2

Part single/part two-storey rear extension. Two side dormers to roof.

5 Eastern Road, N2

Demolition of part front garden wall. Create vehicle hardstanding and crossover.

29 Fordington Road, N6

Single-storey rear and side extension. Conversion of garage to habitable accommodation. Loft conversion, including two side dormers, two front and one rear dormer.

Burglars caught in the act

Two men were caught red handed as they tried to burgle a property on Church Lane on Friday 4 August. Officers responded to calls and arrived with a dog unit and arrested one 29 year old man. Another man aged 23 was chased along The Walks and arrested a short time later.

A police helicopter circled round the area for about an hour trying to track down any other suspects. Local residents who heard the helicopter used social media to try to find out what was happening. "Loads of police arrived and there was a big chase," said one resident. "I live two doors away and I know they caught one of them because he was in handcuffs outside my house."
